Study Options

Trinity provides three distance learning study models that enable you to create an education program that best suits your busy schedule and learning needs. Each study model can be used individually or in combination to complete your degree.

INDEPENDENT STUDY COURSES

- ✓ Study at your own pace over a 12-month period
- ✓ Receive course materials via the Internet or postal delivery
- ✓ Complete your studies over an extended period of time

ONLINE COURSES

- ✓ Study with others online—any time, any day, from any location
- ✓ Participate in online discussions with others in the course
- ✓ Complete a whole course within 8 to 12 weeks

WEBINAR AND REGIONAL COURSES

- ✓ Study with others in face-to-face seminars or in real-time online
- ✓ Concentrate your study time
- ✓ Complete assignments before or after the classroom experience

Bachelor of Arts Program

Trinity offers the Bachelor of Arts degree with 7 different majors. The BA degree Major in Youth Ministry consists of 120 credits minimum across the areas of General Education Core Studies, General Electives Studies, Bible Core Studies, and Major Core Studies.

PURPOSE OF THE BA DEGREE

To develop in learners foundational knowledge and analytical skills within a Christian worldview that will equip them for ministry and community service.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE – 120 CREDITS MINIMUM

- ✓ RW 001 Trinity Tutorial – 0 credits
- ✓ General Education Core Studies – 30 credits
 - Required Core Courses – 6 credits
 - Elective Core Courses – 24 credits
- ✓ General Electives Studies – 30 credits
- ✓ Bible Core Studies – 30 credits (at least 15 through Trinity)
- ✓ Major Core Studies – 30 credits (at least 15 through Trinity)
- ✓ RW 991 Mission Outcomes Assessment – 0 credits

A maximum of 90 credits may be satisfied via transfer credit or a combination of transfer credit and experiential learning portfolio or equivalent credit. Experiential learning portfolio credit and credit by examination cannot exceed 30 credits total.

General Education Core Studies

General Education Core Studies form 30 credits of the 120 credits minimum for the BA degree Major in Youth Ministry. Six of these credits are from required writing courses, and 24 of these credits are from studies across four subject areas.

- ✓ **Natural Sciences Subject Area** – 3 credits as GE 230 Physical Science Survey
- ✓ **Health/Lifestyle Wellness Subject Area** – 3 credits as GE 239 Health and Lifestyle Wellness
- ✓ **Subject Area Electives** – 12 credits from any 4 courses of general education studies

General Electives and Bible Core Studies

General Electives Studies form 30 credits of the 120 credits minimum for the BA degree Major in Youth Ministry, and Bible Core Studies form another 30 of those credits. General Electives Studies may be from any subject area. Bible Core Studies are from specific Old Testament, New Testament, Biblical Studies, and Theology courses.

Major in Youth Ministry

The Bachelor of Arts degree Major in Youth Ministry is the focused area of study designed to prepare a student for a specific career path or professional goal. Courses in the major define the subject areas of expertise being developed by the student.

PURPOSE OF THE MAJOR

To develop competent persons for the position of youth minister in the local church, a position grounded in a biblical theology of youth ministry, knowledgeable in essentials of leading and managing a youth ministry and other ministry programs, and able to guide the ministry relevant to the needs of youth and the church.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. Learners will identify and discuss leadership and management essentials in guiding and growing youth ministry in the church.
2. Learners will explore leadership and ministry issues related to other ministry programs in the church.
3. Learners will describe and discuss needs of youth and the church to inform their leadership and ministry practice.
4. Learners will specify and support a biblical and sound theology of youth ministry.

Major Core Studies

Major Core Studies form 30 credits of the 120 credits minimum for the BA degree Major in Youth Ministry. Major Core Studies are from Youth Ministry, Biblical Counseling, Conflict Management, Pastoral Ministry, and Christian Education subject areas.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ Complete the program of study with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher
- ✓ Complete a minimum of 120 credits of which at least 30 credits are through Trinity with 15 in Bible Core studies and 15 in Major Core studies
- ✓ Satisfy all financial obligations to Trinity

TUITION AND FEES
